YEAR 10 – 12th–16th June
YEAR 12 – 17th–21st July

This year, both our Year 10s and Year 12s had the opportunity to take part in a work experience week, this is a vital part of our students education and prepares them for working life.

Why do Work Experience?

Spending some time with an employer, doing simple tasks, work shadowing or watching an experienced employer at work can be hugely beneficial for our students.

The reasons for doing work experience include:

- Developing transferable skills such as communication and teamwork
- Understanding how an organisation works
- Building confidence
- Enhanced opportunities for part-time and casual employment
- Provides valuable content in a CV or a UCAS statement

CASE STUDY

Alman completed his work experience with In Contrast who design and make promotional displays for various retailers, below he tells us more about his week:

I went to a company called Incontrast located in Gillingham Business Park. The company is part of the STI Group located in Germany. They have many branches across Europe but they only have one in England. I wanted to do this as in my future I want to venture into graphic design which I can do if I can understand and develop my skills.

During the placement I had to create a product which I would later turn into a unit, I enjoyed the task I was given as I could be part of every part of the production, from making it in the office then it being an actual product. I was also given other small tasks to improve my photoshop skills, they involved putting an advert over a billboard in photoshop.

During my placement everything went smoothly with no bumps but the coffee machine is really loud and can be heard from a mile away, I also didn't enjoy sitting for long periods while working in the office.

I achieved many of my targets that I had set myself such as the ability to be organised and flexible. I liked my work experience as I was able to improve my photoshop skills and know how it is to be an employee. I am unsure about my future career plan but the skills I have learnt in this placement that will help me in the future would be teamwork, teamwork makes things run much quicker and that is key, as at Incontrast clients give very short deadlines.

My advice to another student that may do this next year is to be ready to be doing a lot of stuff and to have some sort of knowledge in photoshop, if you get stuck you can search your problem on google and if you still don't know then ask.



CASE STUDY

Calum completed his work experience with Gillingham Football Club, more about his week below:

Monday: Spent the day with the Head of Media. I researched other football clubs social media pages and inputted information on a spreadsheet. Spoke with Academy manager who showed me how he put together and arrange fixtures.

Tuesday: Set the gym up for U18 squad with the physio. Done some work in the gym, a training session and played in a game with U18 (6v6) and scored a goal. Had lunch with the team and coach Mark Moss. Healthy protein – Chicken & rice.

Wednesday: Spent time with Joe Comper (Head of Operations) & Nick Farr (Player Care Manager). Had chat and got some good advice from 1st team manager Neil Harris. Watched the cameraman and press team put together press release of a new player who got signed and had a good conversation with him about academy life.

Thursday: With the U18 coach and team today – training sessions and circuit training – worked hard, lots of running, dribbling with the ball and a game of handball.

When did you leave The Howard School?

I left in 2018 after finishing my A Levels.

Did you go to the Howard School?

What are your favourite memories of School?

The Festival Day of Sports was my favourite event of the year as I used to compete in Athletics and the day I received my GCSE results was fantastic as I achieved much better grades than I'd expected.

What do you do now?

I work for Aon who are a global provider of risk management services, insurance and reinsurance brokerage, and human resource consulting and outsourcing. In my current role in Downstream Energy Broking team, I work with clients in the post-production of crude oil and natural gas activities to get their assets insured.

Additionally, I also help midstream companies (those involved in the transportation and storage of crude oil and gas) to get insurance too.

How did you get to where you are today?

I have always worked hard and set myself targets. When I first began to study for my GCSE's I didn't really know what career I wanted so I worked as hard as possible in each subject as I knew this would open up opportunities for me as I grew up. As a result, I ended up getting some really good GCSE results and decided that one of the subjects I wanted to study during my A-Levels was Business Studies as I'd enjoyed the subject a lot towards the end of my GCSE's. After I left school and went university, I studied International Business which provided me with the opportunity to enter the Insurance sector.

What are your plans for the future?

I'm keen to gain some experience in the risk management and consulting side of the business so that's an area I may try and move to once I finish the graduate programme next April. Additionally, with the number of offices we have worldwide, I'm very keen to experience living and working in another country that's my aim for my mid/late twenties.
