Ms Cordell Head of Performing Arts

Welcome to our 7th edition of this academic year's newsletter, I'm Ms Cordell and I'm now in my 16th year teaching at The Howard School, which makes me one of the longest serving members of our school's teaching staff! I am Head of Performing Arts (Drama and Music) as well as being the school's Vocational Subject Lead, which means I support other teachers with the administration and delivery of qualifications such as BTECs. Although I initially trained and worked as an English specialist, I have always had a real passion for the important role that Drama and Music can play in a young person's life.

Participating in the Arts enables children not only to explore their world, but also to comment on the kind of world they wish to see. In fact, the Government widely acknowledges that the Arts can make a powerful contribution to a child's health and wellbeing. So Performing Arts in schools isn't just about developing the artists, performers, creators and writers of the future, it's about helping our youngest pupils to build a strong set of life skills which will support them, not only throughout their school journey, but in adulthood too. Confidence, teamwork, leadership, creativity, problem-solving, resilience, acting on feedback and presentation are all essential skills for well-rounded adults of the future.

This term in Drama, we are exploring theatrical techniques and script writing, ready to begin an exciting devising project after Easter. Our Year 9 pupils in both Music and Drama have been busy developing a really strong foundation for their GCSE studies with Year 9 working on their music theory in our new state-of-the-art Mac suite! Meanwhile, our Year 9 Drama students have spent this week performing their brilliant production of *Lord of the Flies* to younger pupils. Pupils in Years 10 and 11 are busy preparing for performances, exams and external assessments with an AQA GCSE Drama examiner in school this week to see our fantastic Year 11 students in action. Performing Arts continues all the way into 6th form with our Year 13s currently working on two public performances to conclude their studies before they go onto university or into employment.



The Children's Mental Health Week event held at The Corn Exchange in Rochester, organized by Medway Council, was a vibrant and engaging celebration aimed at promoting positive mental health among children. The event successfully brought together students who not only participated actively but also served as excellent ambassadors for mental health awareness.

One of the highlights of the event was the diverse range of activities that catered to the interests of the attending children. The enthusiastic involvement of the students in these activities showcased their commitment to embracing the importance of mental health in a fun and interactive way. It was evident that the event not only served as a platform for entertainment but also as an opportunity for education, fostering a sense of community and understanding around the significance of mental well-being.

Currently in year 8, students are working towards exploring music composition on the Apple Macs. Students are using a software called GarageBand to break down composition into its three major areas: Melody, Harmony, and Rhythm. Each lesson, students are focusing on one of the three areas of and adding new instrumental parts, creating drum loops, composing melodies and adding chords to their pieces. They will also explore effects and mixing techniques to help build a full piece of music of their own creation by the end of Term 3!

Measles Information for Parents and Carers

Protect your child from measles

You may have seen measles in the news recently. This is because there has been a rise in the number of measles cases in England. Measles is highly infectious and can make people seriously unwell. One-in-five children with the disease are hospitalised and on rare occasions, measles can be fatal.

The NHS are urging parents and carers to make sure their children are up-to-date with their MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccinations. Two doses of the MMR vaccinations are needed for maximum life-long protection. Parent and carers of children in Years 8 and 11 will be automatically contacted by the School-aged Immunisation Service to catch up on missed MMR doses if they are already scheduled a vaccine.

If your child isn't in Years 8 and 11 you should check your child's red book to see what vaccinations they have had or ask your GP practice. You can make an appointment with your GP practice to catch up on any missed doses, or call the School-aged Immunisation Service to arrange a vaccination. The early symptoms of measles include: a high fever, sore red, watery eyes, coughing, a runny nose, aching and feeling generally unwell. Find out more about the symptoms of measles on the NHS website.

If you have symptoms of measles stay at home and phone your GP practice or NHS 111. This will help prevent spread of the disease.






Year 9 students are being rewarded with a special breakfast for an excellent start to their GCSE programmes of study, following their first assessment cycle! When asked what the secret is, they said:




